Blogged Environment is a world of alternative perspectives, book reviews and personal contributions direct from our editors and contributors across the built environment. We welcome comments and contribution, and do not restrict ourselves to any profession, region, or media.

This blog builds on our other work. We include:

- **Updates** on issues relating to our publications, scrutinising the learning from our [Built Environment Journal issues](#) and [Planning, History & Environment books](#) and encouraging further deliberation and application of their topics, as well as further commentary on the themes of existing [Blogged Environment posts](#);
- **Reviews** of formative works in the Built Environment field whether expressed through a book, exhibition, event, legislation, film, or other medium. We also include a strand on seminal books following [the example of our editorial team](#);
- **Agendas** for further work, whether research, debate or direct action, that draws on new insight into the built environment as it is, was or should be.

Blog pieces demand attention, they are responsive and will be made live within days of writing and are free to read. Pieces on the *Blogged Environment* are part of a long-standing, broad ranging and on-going dialogue in our Journal, taking that existing work forwards by:

- linking to existing material online;
- communicating in an engaging and personal manner;
- & promoting further thought, writing and exchange.

- number of Illustrations (*min. 1 photo/graphic, resolution c. 200dpi, & with appropriate permissions e.g. creative commons*)
- & the length of piece (*we recommend c. 700-1200 words*)
